Looking for a few bird lovers

Sierra Wildlife Rescue is looking to site a few more "release cages" for songbirds that are preparing to be

returned to the wild. Spending time in a release cage is the important final step to fulfill our 3Rs mission to "rescue, rehabilitate and return" to the wild injured and orphaned wildlife.

The 8-foot-square release cages would be built by volunteers on a level and shaded location. Specifically, we're looking for locations with elevations between 3000-4000 feet and 1000-1500 feet to accommodate different species of songbirds. By the time songbirds are in release cages, the care they need is minimal...simply providing food and water (which would be supplied by SWR). Birds typically remain in the release cage for 7 to 10 days before being released. Hosting a release cage is a rewarding and exciting experience for anyone who loves our native songbirds. Our hope is to place the release cages for this year's bird season, so time is of the essence. Interested in more information? Please contact Joan Winton at 916-202-0794.
